## Best practice at *Borough Viaduct*

### Overview:

*To reinforce our positive impact on the local community, Skanska and Network Rail manned a stall in Borough Market to explain to local business, residents, and visitors the work done in the area and the wider Thameslink programme.*



*During half-term week, a group from Skanska, Network Rail, and Oxford Archaeology set up a stall in Jubilee Yard to explain the work we have been doing in the local area. This consisted of information boards, a video of the bridge slide, freebies from Skanska and Network Rail, and an 'archaeology pit' for children to discover and sketch artefacts buried in the sand pits.*



*Employees from the project teams answered questions and guided visitors through the displays.*



*Engineers from Skanska were on hand to explain the complexities of the engineering work and the difficulties of constructing a 1080 tonne steel bridge in a working market. Oxford Archaeologists used real finds to show both adults and children the methods used when looking for artefacts and to provide further details of the significant Roman building found at 11-15 Borough High Street. Employees from Network Rail were able to provide details of how the works currently underway at Borough tie in with the forthcoming works at London Bridge and the wider Thameslink Programme.*
